



1. **CHAIRMAN'S OPENING STATEMENT-** - None
2. **SELECTMEN'S MINUTES-** Mr. Turbin made a motion to accept the September 28, 2015 minutes. Mr. Hogeland seconded the motion. The motion passed 5-0-0.
3. **PUBLIC HEARING:** New Wine and Malt License for Hops and Vines MA, LLC d/b/a the Log by H&V, 78 Spring Street, Williamstown, Manager Robert Beuth. The consideration of the license was continued to the October 26, 2015 meeting.
4. **LICENSES AND PERMITS-** None
5. **ITEMS FOR SELECTMEN'S CONSIDERATION:**
 - a. Williams College Building Plans Presentation (Kolesar, Puddester) Fred Puddester and Jim Kolesar presented various building plans intended to enhance academics, student life and Spring Street vitality. The college representatives shared their plans on enhanced green spaces around Sawyer Library and the new science center. Spring Street projects included the new inn, bookstore and the connector from Hoxsey to South Street. This connector allows connectivity from the Clark Art to the downtown. Stephanie Boyd of Waterman Place asked about pedestrian walkways and bike access. The Cultural District was also interested in creating access to the Clark. Final plans have not been completed but pedestrian and bike accesses will be evaluated. These projects are in various stages of completion. Chairman Patton thanked the college for sharing their future plans.
 - b. Mount Greylock Regionalization Agreement- The Mount Greylock School Committee and Lanesborough Board of Selectmen were meeting at the same time as the Williamstown Board of Selectmen. No action was taken pending the outcome of the former meeting.
