Yes, we are hosting the AARP Tax Aide program again this year. First you need to know that there are updated requirements to be heeded and acted upon before you come in for your appointment. Here we go;

You all know that there is an envelope with paperwork in it for you to pick up and complete before for your appointment. Let me stress that you MUST PICK UP AND COMPLETE the paper work in the envelope BEFORE you return for your appointment. Don't show up to your appointment and expect to fill it out here. All pertinent forms MUST be filled out prior to your arrival for your appointment.

All documents needed to complete your taxes MUST accompany you to your appointment so be sure to gather your ALL forms first. If you are missing paperwork or haven't filled in all the appropriate spaces, it delays the preparation which impacts the next person waiting for their turn and can result in late nights for the volunteer preparers as well. That's not something we want to happen.

Be aware that that the tax preparers will not be able to do your taxes at the time of your appointment if the necessary forms are not completed and/or you are missing necessary tax documents.

So...don't even think about coming in with incomplete documentation or unfinished forms, our preparers won't be able to help you and you'll have to try find another appointment.

OK, here's the skinny on how to arrange an appointment.

It looks like we'll be taking appointments beginning February 1<sup>st</sup> between 9:30 am and 12:30pm. Not before 9:30, not after 12:30.

Please don't leave us messages on the answering service regarding tax appointments. We want to talk with you live.

Appointments will be available on Tuesday evenings between 6:00 and 9:00 and Saturdays from 9:30 until 2:00. The schedule will run from Tuesday February 6<sup>th</sup> and end on April 16<sup>th</sup>.
